

District 45 Vision Screening

May, 2021

We have survived 2020. It is Spring 2021, and the Lion year is coming to a close.

As Vision Screening Coordinator it has been a year I will never forget. Last year at this time, we had no idea what lay ahead or have any idea how to proceed. I must say, Lions *know* what to do in a crisis. We learned how to negotiate Zoom meetings, hold safe cabinet meetings (Kudos, DG Pam!) and figured out how to do vision screenings in safe though sometimes unconventional ways. 9 nurses stepped up and volunteered to do the screenings in their schools so Lions would not have to do so in person. Other Lions kept in close contact with their schools to be ready when the call came and it was thought safe for *them* to proceed...and proceed they did! As of April 25th, because of their ingenuity and commitment, 9099 children were reported screened throughout the school year with 987 referrals being made. Not bad when we questioned if we were even going to do ANY screenings at all this year. I could not be happier or prouder of everyone.

To compliment the program, I am working to add a new aspect to our Vision Screening. KidSight.org has created a training program where Visioneers can become "Certified Vision Screeners" adding a level of professionalism to the process. It will not be mandatory and will take minimal time to complete. I would encourage all our Visioneers to at least consider it and check it out online. I hope to provide more information about it at Cabinet meetings throughout the coming year.

I have begun to receive requests for camera reservations so I will be reviewing and tweaking the camera schedule in the coming weeks. If your club plans to screen this fall, please send me your request and I will try to accommodate everyone as best I can.

May you all have a safe and happy Spring. I look forward to working with you all in the coming year.

The owners of the Inn are graciously renting the Inn to us for the same price we would be paying Covenant Hills.

The Green Mountain Lions Camp (pending some final approvals) is a go for this summer!!! We already have several campers preregistered for the teen sessions. The CDC and State of Vermont just released summer camp guidelines so we will be reviewing those, updating our procedures to make sure everyone is safe. Most of the activities that we could do at Covenant Hills we can do at McIndoe Falls Inn but there are also additional options that we did not have at Covenant Hills.

Because of the new venue, we will not be having a clean-up day in June. However, we will need help collecting our camp supplies from Covenant Hill and transporting to the Inn. We don't have a specific day but we anticipate planning to do such the first week in July. We will definitely need Lions to help us set up and clean up at the end.

At this time, we do have a preliminary wish list: Vinyl tablecloths Tie-dying materials including white T-Shirts Large tent for doing crafts Tables and chairs Croquet Set Volleyball / badminton net. This is just a beginning. You will hear more from the committee on additional needs. Some of these items would be a purchase / donation while others would be borrowed (tent, tables, chairs).


Heartland Lions Club:

NorShaft Lions Club:



My name is Karen Burnell and I have been chairing the very small Pill Bottle Project Committee for Norshaft Lions since June of 2020. There have been Norshaft Lions who have taken on this charge before me and done an exceptional job developing and maintaining the Project. I can speak to my experience and provide information as to how the Committee has functioned during the Pandemic as well as share the ideas that we would like to explore/implement once the health and resources of our community allow.

Matthew 25: Ministries located in Cincinnati, Ohio has been collecting empty plastic pill bottles for years to send with shipments of medical supplies to developing countries. Norshaft Lions is committed to supporting their efforts.

Reports of medical providers at clinics handing patients medicine in a piece of paper or tissue, due to lack of supplies, rather than a bottle to assure that the medicine remains clean, safe and available were compelling. Most Lions have these valuable bottles readily available right within our households, many of which may have ended up being recycled or deposited in our local landfills.

Norshaft's participation in this project, supports our club's current goals of Supporting Health, and Caring for our Environment.

Since June 2020, our club has sent 3955 bottles to the Ministries, with more to be prepared for shipment in the very near future. Due to the Pandemic and related restrictions, this was one our club's projects that could easily continue.

At the current time, the Ministries will accept any size, color, translucent prescription pill bottle, which has been thoroughly cleaned (remove labels, glue residue and washed). These bottles are sent with medical supplies. They will also accept over the counter pill bottles for recycling. Due to the cost of shipment to Ohio, we only send prescription pill bottles. If we receive over the counter pill bottles in our donations, we recycle them locally.

During the Pandemic, our members are our greatest source and provider of pill bottles. We have contact free drop offs at Bennington Tire, and at two of the committee members homes. In the near past, the Post Office, the Methodist Church, Urbon Complete Car Care and the Elementary School, all in Shaftsbury, were collectors and/or drop off sites for bottles. Members would bring bottles to our monthly meetings.

The "work" of the committee right now is pretty simple. It includes:

- Physically collecting bottles
- Checking each bottle to assure labels and glue residue is completely removed
- Washing each bottle in hot soapy water, letting them dry.
- · Sorting by color and type



- Place in zip lock bags, mark as CLEAN and with number of bottles in bag.
- Package in cartons and mail.
- The only expense right now, is the cost of Ziploc bags and shipping costs.

There are 3 of us that share this labor or love right now, Lions Karen Urbon, myself, and Jay Burnell assists as well.

As the risk of Covid 19 infection reduces and with the expansion of the Norshaft Lions now providing services to the towns of Bennington and Pownal, it is our hope to increase the reach of the project through contacts to elementary schools, churches and pharmacies. Social media will be utilized to inform the general public of the opportunity to recycle and reuse these bottles. In addition, we would like to locate a community partner who will assist us with shipping. The cost to mail approximately 300 bottles in a 16"x16"x17" sized carton is approximately \$48.00. Our current budget for mailing is \$800.00.

With expansion, will come the need to increase the budget and committee size, so we have more members available to prepare the bottles for shipping.



How do clubs and districts individually benefit from reporting service?

- » Reporting service helps transfer knowledge and best practices to your club's future leaders. Club officers can review past service activity reports, learn from the successes of the club's previous activities and better plan for their future activities.
- » Reporting service is a matter of local pride. Reporting puts your club on the map as leaders in your local community, and it's an important way to share success with other clubs in your district and around the world.
- » A high percentage of clubs reporting service is a sign of a healthy district.
- » Reporting service allows you to become eligible for service awards.

How do clubs and districts collectively benefit from reporting service?

- » Reporting shines a light on how and where local clubs are making a difference. This elevates the profile of Lions Clubs International as a global service club organization.
- » Service reports provide tangible evidence of our global engagement and impact to prospective partners of Lions Clubs International. These relationships strengthen the organization and yield benefits at the local level.
- » People want to participate in real, visible change. Service reporting allows clubs to continually engage communities, tell stories more effectively and ultimately grow their member base.

How does reporting service benefit the people we serve?

- » Service data helps everyone understand the needs of communities around the world and how our Lions and Leos are serving those needs
- » Because service activities are scalable, one small service project can become the next global initiative of the organization. But Lions Clubs International is not aware of such projects unless they are reported.
- » Service data enables Lions Clubs International to identify best practices that can be shared globally.
- » Measurement leads to insight. Setting higher goals each year mobilizes the organization toward growth.
- Service reports show how Lions and Leos around the world are using funds from Lions Clubs International Foundation grants to serve their communities. This visibility encourages Lions and Leos to think creatively about their own projects and apply for LCIF grants themselves.

Additional benefits

- » Reporting is the final step in completing a service project. If it's not reported, it's not done!
- » Reporting service is a lot like voting. You may think your report doesn't make a big difference, but the only way we'll be successful is if everyone does their small part.
- » Reporting is considered service in itself. The time clubs and districts spend reporting their service are considered volunteer hours, and can be reported in MyLion.
