Vision Screening Report July 2021

We did it! We got through another year of vision screening for the children of Vermont. It wasn't easy, but Vermont Lions made the best of a tough situation and shined and smiled all the while. Final count saw 9414 students screened with 1033 referrals being made. I was still receiving reports right up to the end of May which again goes to show that Lions will not quit until the whole job is done.

I have attached the camera schedules for the 2021-2022 Lion year. It has been slightly adjusted to include a couple new clubs, but overall, it is consistent with past years. I am aware that most nurses hope to screen their students in September and October, but as we have limited equipment, not all schools can be scheduled the start of school. I do hope to purchase an additional camera this fall to help with the increase in interest which is very exciting. Please feel free to call or email me if you have any questions around scheduling as I am always willing to see what I can do to accommodate clubs if possible.

Again, as I have said and will continue to say, thank you to all the members of District 45 who serve their communities in this most important and valued project.





In June, the club hosted an Orientation for newer members at Lion Ed Metcalfe's Vermont Distillers at Hogback Mountain in Marlboro Vermont. 


Castleton Lions Club:

PRESS RELEASE

Lions Club International recommends an <u>annual community needs assessment</u>. Upon reviewing the recommended steps, the Norwich Lions Club decided on a simpler process to achieve the desired goal to understand those <u>unmet needs</u> in the community that our club might be able to address.

The methodology was to ask two questions of community leaders in Norwich and Hartford, Vermont that included:

- School principals
- Librarians
- Recreation directors
- · Fire chiefs
- · Police chiefs
- Health institution administrators
- · Inns and hotels
- Restaurants
- Social service agencies
- Churches

The two questions were:


- What do you consider are the one or two most important and pressing unmet needs in (Town name)?
- Taking into consideration the retirement-age demographic of most of our club members, how might the Norwich Lions Club and its members best help to address the unmet needs, that you describe?

Five club members made 33 contacts. Responses were received from about half of those. Health topics and homelessness were mentioned in about 70% of the responses regarding unmet needs. Child-related topics represented about 20%. The club is focused on addressing the following ideas that surfaced from the topics brought forward:

Funding: Establish a referral relationship with a social service organization to address acute financial needs for medications or veterinary aftercare for families and isolated individuals in need.

Volunteer time: Establish a cadre of volunteers, who could accompany children on foot to after-school activities, coordinated through the primary school, and another cadre to provide rides for isolated individuals to appointments.

Specialized skills: Establish a relationship with schools and public service organizations to provide Grant-writing and other advocacy skills.
