Continue to BE KIND with service from the HEART.

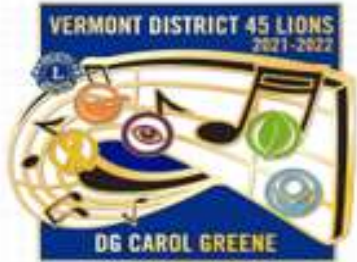

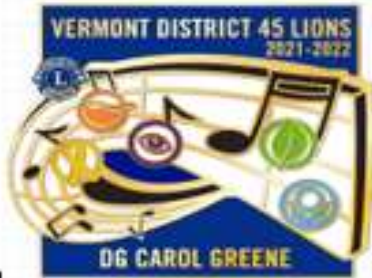
