

In 2018 an ambitious campaign to raise 300 million in 3 years was created. The goal for Campaign 100 was to empower Lions to serve 200 million people each year. Raising these funds it would help to ensure we would continue to have the resources to increase our service impact. In 2020 after evaluating the impact that the COVID-19 crisis was having on Campaign 100, LCIF extended the duration of Campaign by one year. As a whole globally the campaign has reached 271.7 million. We are now on our final 2 months of the campaign, our hope is to continue to excel to District 45's ambitious goal of \$200,168. Currently our total funds raised including pledges is \$175,070.73, with 65.65% club participation and 88.96 % of our goal. Although \$25,097.27 remains to complete our goal, we should all be very proud and not give up. There are several ways you can continue to help reach our goal.

At our recent spring convention we raised \$2002 dollars between the battle of the boards corn hole challenge, musical chairs, countdown to campaign 100 raffle, basket raffle and the lunch box social. Thank to all who participated in any way, it was so very much appreciated. Special thanks to District Governor Carol who supported and allowed all the campaign 100 fundraising during her convention.

## TALES OF THE SERVICE TRAIL UPDATE - May 2022

Once again, I ask all of us to pray for all Ukraine that comes to their senses this destruction and killing can stop. While there were then 4 million refugees who fled the country as of last month's "Tales", with another 10-12 million are displaced from their homes. Currently, the refugees exceed 9 million people, with over one-quarter of the country displaced from their homes and subject to relentless bombings of even schools and civilian shelters. There are about 600 -700 Lions still in Ukraine and their clubs are still active. They were offered dues relief by LCI but they refused such action. They have received direct LCI financial assistance to continue their new service of providing relief to the Ukrainian people. LCIF's "Refugee and Displaced Persons" fund has provided relief services in many Eastern European countries as well. Several European Districts have also provided direct financial support totaling tens of millions dollars, it has been reported. PLEASE - donate what you can to this LCIF project. This is each of the US, and OUR Foundation, working for humanity once again.

#### To the normal update:

Spring has sprung, at least some days here in Central Maine. The trips have continued, along with a couple of Zoom conventions in Iowa and Pennsylvania. Iowa 9NW was planned, but the Pennsylvania 14G was unplanned as we developed very mild but clearly positive Covid, despite Vaccines and boosters. They probably kept it at bay mostly, along with the antiviral drugs. Fortunately, we cleared with plenty of time to attend the LCI Board meeting.

LCI Board meetings are the "run the business side" of this director position. For me it was formal and informal meetings interspersed with long committee sessions. Being the vice-chair of Constitution and By-Laws is a busy slot on a busy committee capably led by the chair Lion Shay Nickels, an Associate Justice of the Kentucky Supreme Court. We are joined by Daisuke Kura, a Japanese trial lawyer, and PIP Al Brandel. I believe that we are a strong team with trial lawyers balanced by a Lion who knows the Lion players around the world where disputes have arisen. The combination makes the work interesting with a sense of history and local traditions. Karol and her fellow Partners-in-

Service did projects, such as renovating a park one day. Karol spent much time shoveling and raking stone but was able to work with local Lions and be outdoors!

For several months, I have closed each "Tales" with ten ideas for finding new members (totally stolen from other Lions). The response continues warming, so here are ten more ideas:

- 31. Find the virtual world build a website get a social media presence.
- 32. Have members use their social media contacts to promote projects.
- 33. Put posters in public areas.
- 34. Ask companies and employers to sponsor memberships and pay dues.
- 35. Recognize and reward Lions who bring in new Lions.
- 36. Create more FUN!
- 37. Give a 3-month guarantee of satisfaction or dues & fees returned.
- 38. Invite the media to cover well-known speakers.
- 39. Use word of month.
- 40. Have Lions network with coworkers, friends, and family.
