Vision Screening Report July 2022

I would like to begin this report by thanking all of the clubs and members of District 45 for their dedication and commitment to the Vision Screening Program for the 2021-2022 Lion year. This year we were, through persistance and with Lion courage, able to screen 14535 students. Out of that number 1661 children were given referrals to further check their vision.

As it is well known, learning is 80% visual. With this program we help ensure our children are seeing the best they can and get the help they may need as soon as they can. This is important when little ones are at their most obsorbable. They are sponges. They take everything in and being able to see clearly effects that learning. To see clearly, children are more interested in the things around them. They notice the little things in their world that would otherwise go unnoticed, things that are important in their learning experiences. Yes, I know I'm preaching to the choir here, but I want you all to remember the affect you have on children's lives and possibly their futures.

Though we are usually welcomed into the elementry schools, we can not stop screening at age 6. We need to continue to try and get into those middle schools and high schools because as we know, eyes continue to change even after children enter first grade. So we will continue to talk, and talk and talk somemore until principals and school administraters understand the value of SPOT vision screening, not just for our youngest population, but for our middle schoolers and teens as well.

I hope you have all had a great year and with the new Lion year only a few days away, I wish you all and happy and healthy new year!


