A member of the Bradshaw Mountain of Dewey-Humboldt Lions Club, Past President Preston has been a Lion since 1974. He has held many offices in the association, including club president, zone chairperson, district governor, council chairperson and chairperson of district leadership development, Lions Quest and MERL for the state of Arizona. He was host chairperson of the 1994 International Convention in Phoenix, Arizona, chairperson of the 2003 USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum, and a national/multinational coordinator for Campaign SightFirst II.

In recognition of his service to the association, Past President Preston has received numerous awards, including the 100% Club President Award, the 100% District Governor Award, the Senior Builder Key Award, Life Membership in the association, nine International President's Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. He is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

To All Club Presidents, Club Secretaries and Past District Governors

The election of District 45 Officers: District Governor, 1st Vice District Governor and 2nd Vice District Governor is to be done at the annual Spring Convention, April 28 – 30, 2023 as part of the business meeting to be held Saturday, April 29, 2023.

<u>CLUB DELEGATE FORMULA</u>: Each chartered club in good standing in Lions Club International and this District shall be entitled to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each ten (10) members, who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in the club or major fraction thereof, of said club as shown by the records of the international office on the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the convention is held. The major fraction referred to in this section shall be five (5) or more members. Each certified delegate present in person shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote only for each office to be filled by, and one (1) vote only on each question submitted to, the respective convention. Unless otherwise specified herein, the affirmative vote of a majority of the delegates voting on any question shall be the act of the convention. All delegates must be members in good standing of a club in good standing in this district.

Attached is a list of each club and number of delegates, alternates plus the Past District 45 Governors for each club. A Past District Governor may cast a ballot as a club delegate OR as a past District Governor but not both.

Please let us know by April 26th who your club delegates are. Please also let us know if the Past District Governor(s) for your club are going to be voting as a delegate for your club or if they are voting individually.

We look forward to seeing ALL in Manchester, Vermont for this very important election, and hearing from you in regards to your club representation.







Tips & Ideas to Enhance Your Lions Club

April 2023

Write a simple and effective brochure. Here's one club's story.

To interested people in Lions, every club needs to tell their own story. A simple brochure will help.

I was delighted to be handed the terrific brochure that the Granville Lions had just published. Check it out! It has a very clean, appealing look, gets to the point quickly, and let's people in on what makes Lions special.

How did it come together, and what does Granville wish to say most? I asked Lion Linda Ellingsworth, who offers guidelines that apply to any club, yours included.

It had to "tell a *concise story* of who the Granville Lions are" Linda says, because in today's world, readers will only give you a brief moment. She "distilled our message to its essentials, while conveying the pride and satisfaction Lions derive from serving the community and the world." Their brochure left <u>out</u> anything that wouldn't grab the reader's interest, because cutting (for brevity) and editing (for clarity) are important in effectively communicating your story.

"After some discussion, it was suggested that a simple *two-sided card* might make a more immediate impression than a traditional tri-fold."

A bonus is that its size [3.75" x 8.25"] fits a rack display (like you find at the entrance to restaurants and other public places). It's small enough to post on a crowded bulletin board; and handy enough to offer up at a pancake breakfast or other Lions event, or include with a donation – to help explain who the gift came from.

Lion Linda says it's important to "write to your audience" and this one "is intensely local."

"We wanted to convey to potential members that the Granville Lions Club is composed of ordinary people who care passionately about their community. That is the focus of the front of the piece." Her copy makes an immediate impact. And, in big letters, says "JOIN US!"

"On the back, we highlighted our major contributions to the community, and included information about Lions International and its mission, to give people context of the bigger picture of the organization." It says, 'When you become a Lion, you become part of a global network of volunteers working together to make a difference. '

"I should note," says Linda, "that I took advantage of verbiage and graphics available for use on the LCI website. They also tell you the precise colors to use with the Lions logo, which is very helpful." (See: https://www.lionsclubs.org/en/resources-for-members/brand-guidelines.)

Another useful tip: Linda used VistaRrint to design and print this piece. "They have a huge assortment of templates to choose from. I think I started with a basic template, then made some changes. I was struggling with trying to make the design more dynamic, and a VistaRrint designer actually worked with the design on my screen while I watched! She did a great job. This is a free service they provide." The brochure's professionalism leaves a great impression! The cost for 500 cards was \$120. "Their quality is excellent and delivery is quick."

There's a lot that others can pick up from the Granville Lions, when getting their clubs into the public eye. And, she adds, a simple brochure is "very doable for anyone with even limited experience doing graphic layout." Give it a go!



Help ensure a smooth transition to the Lion Portal

Make sure your Lion Account information is correct and up to date in MyLCI or your regional reporting system. Note that the new Lion Portal will require a unique, unshared email, and phone numbers will no longer be supported as a log in credential.

Updating member information is simple:

- Log in to the current member portal with your Lion Account credentials
- Navigate to MyLCI
- Select "My Lions Club"
- Select "Members"
- Click on the member whose information you need to update.
- Select "Edit Member" to enter in their revised email address and other updated information.

To help ensure other Lions have a smooth transition to the Lion Portal, check out these helpful downloads:

ATTENTION CLUB SECRETARIES & ADMINS

With the new Member Portal implementation coming soon, now would be a good time to review your member data to insure that it is up to date. Verify and update individual email address (not shared with spouse or partner), insure that the date of birth is correct (not just 1/1/year), etc. With the changeover, if the data is not correct it may make the transition more difficult.



Lion Portal Important Dates!

7/15/23-7/24/23: Target Conversion Date

Before 6/15/23: Enter all club officers for 2023-2024

Before 6/15/23: Enter service activity for events prior to 6/1/23. Reporting for 6/1/23 going forward will be in the new system after conversion

Before 6/15/23: Record any club or donations to LCIF are in the bank with the appropriate supporting documentation for recognition.

Before 6/15/23: Make sure club data is accurate for this year (2022-2023). For Example, new members, sponsors, new clubs formed, transfers and other end of year activities specific to clubs are correct and recorded in MyLion/MyLCI

- Make sure every member has an email listed and no shared emails can be used in the new LIONS PORTAL
- Make sure member birthdays are entered since birth dates in MyLCI will be converted - even the old conversion 1/1/1900 date! Hint: in MyLCI under reports run "Member Information Update Report" and have your members update their info!


