



Official Warning of the Vermont Lions Charities Annual meeting to be held Saturday the 4th of November 2023 at the Hampton Inn in Colchester, Vermont.

This meeting will consist of voting and election for a three year term of a Treasurer and a Secretary as well as the following proposed Constitution and By Law changes.

Proposed Constitution and By Law Changes

- 5. The Board of Directors shall consist of the Officers and Directors; four (4) officers and six (6) directors. Change wording to
- 5. The Board of Directors shall consist of the Officers and Directors: four (4) officers and seven
- (7) directors. (this change is to include both 1st and 2nd Vice District Governors 7. Officers shall be elected for a term of three (3) years. However, terms shall be alternated so that no more than one (1) officers is replaced in any one year. Exceptions: The following officers terms will expire in the same year, Vice President and Secretary. Directors shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year, all Officer and Directors shall continue to serve until their replacement is qualified. Exception: The District

Governor and Vice District Governor shall serve only during their regular term of office (i.e. July 1St to June 30th of the following year

Change wording to

- 7. All officers shall be elected for a three-year term, and all are eligible for re-election. Directors shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year, all Officer and Directors shall continue to serve until their replacement is qualified. Exception: The District Governor and 1st and 2nd Vice District Governors shall serve only during their regular term of office (i.e., July 1st to June 30th of the following year.
- 9. Vacancies: Any vacancy that occurs in the Board of Directors shall by fulled as follows: if it is one of the Officers, by properly warned special election (this election will be only for the unexpired term of said officers). If a Director, a new one shall be appointed by the District Governor (from the same region)

Change wording to

9. Vacancies: Any vacancy that occurs in the Board of Directors shall be filled as follows: if it is one of the Officers, by properly warned special election (this election will be only for the unexpired term of said officers). If a Director, a new one shall be appointed by he District Governor and shall be from the same region as where the vacancy occurred.

22. From time to time to time the President may appoint committees as he may see fit.

Change wording to

22. From time to time the President may appoint committees as he or she may see fit. 25. An annual audit shall be performed at the end of each year and shall be reported to the Membership at the Annual Meeting.

Change to

25. An annual audit shall be performed at the end of each year and shall be reported to the Membership at the annual meeting. The audit committee shall consist of three individuals made up of Past District Governors (PDG), Past Cabinet Secretary Treasurer (PCST) or Past Cabinet Treasurer (PCT).

27. Duties:

President - Shall reside at all meetings

Vice President - Shall act as President in the absence of the President.

Secretary - Shall keep records of all meetings and shall perform such other duties as assigned by the President

Treasurer - Shall keep all financial records. He shall keep funds in such institutions as required by the Board of Directors. He shall only dispense funds upon approval of the Board of Directors.

Change wording for the treasurer to:

27. Duties: President - Shall reside at all meetings

Vice President – Shall act as President in the absence of the President. Secretary – Shall keep records of all meetings and shall perform such other duties as assigned by the President

Treasurer – Shall keep all financial records. He or she shall keep funds in such institutions as required by the Board of Directors. He or she shall only dispense funds upon approval of the Board of Directors.



Vision Screening Report

October, 2023

It doesn't seem possible, but children are back in school and District 45 Lions are once again on the move! Lions are busy with scheduling, school nurses are getting ready for the next few months of vision screening, and reports are beginning to come in. Please remember to report your screenings at least once a month. This makes things easier to keep up with the documentation process.

It's exciting that more clubs are beginning to show an interest in screening the children in their areas. If you are new to screening or just want more information about the process, please feel free to contact me so I can arrange for you to get information or a camera for your use.

This leads to the need for more cameras. That, and the fact that we now have 3 of the original 5 SPOT cameras disabled with no way to get them repaired, it is time for more investment into the program with new equipment. I am in the process of getting a quote from a company called Plusoptics for new cameras. The decision to go with this company was after much thought and research. As most of you know one of the main reasons given to Lions for not allowing us in the schools was because we didn't do acuity testing. Now, the Plusoptic cameras all have the added capability of doing that testing along with the regular screening we're used to with SPOT cameras. I hope to be able to purchase enough cameras to cover the district sufficiently to start and later replace the remaining SPOTS as time goes on.

Some of you may be asking what we are planning for the 6 newer SPOTS we bought a couple of years ago. These cameras will continue to be used. As they age out, we can trade them in for discounts as we purchase more Plusoptics screeners. There are more benefits to switching over to Plusoptics. These new cameras are considerably less expensive, can be upgraded easily by means of a computer (no calibrations necessary) and when coupled with a trade in, qualifies them for a free 5-year service contract. We have always had to pay extra for that in the past. Needless to say, I am extremely excited about the future of vision screening for District 45. We continue to grow and provide more and better services to the children in our commutities.

So if you want to hear more about these new developments in vision screening, please come to the November Forum. It should be quite informative.

It not only is needed for a baby's comfort, but also for a baby's health and wellbeing.

So that all being said, District 45 is starting the Lions Diaper Brigade Drive. Each club can either collect diapers from members, or even better yet, hold their own diaper drive. This will be considered a district wide service project. Each club should keep track of EVERY SINGLE DIAPER they collect. By November Conference I will collect the numbers from each club and the club with the most diapers collected will win a prize (to be determined).

To make this easier for everyone, I have attached a list of the 15 state-mandated parent/child centers. Under each center, you will find their addresses and phone numbers. Clubs are to look for their club's names under their center's contact information. Hopefully I've assigned each club to the closest center for their convenience. Clubs can begin to bring their diapers collected so far to their parent/child center.

Please feel free to collect and deliver in which ever way works best for your club. Some clubs may wish to collect diapers throughout the month of October and present them all at once for a fantastic photo op at their PPC, or if space is an issue, make weekly drop-offs. I do ask one thing however. PLEASE CALL YOUR PARENT CHILD CENTER BEFORE DROP OFF. This way they can direct you to the correct building or door for everyone's convenience. I have already begun to get reports of diaper collections from some clubs, so don't delay! Start your diaper drive today. Let's make this a WHOLE DISTRICT SERVICE PROJECT. We can do this!

Proposed Changes to District 45 Constitution and Bylaws

At the Cabinet Meeting on August 19th, the following Proposed Changes to the District 45 Constitution and By-Laws were discussed. It was voted to bring these changes to a vote at the upcoming Fall Conference and Cabinet Meeting on November 4th, 2023. If passed, these changes would be effective immediately.

While most of the Proposed Changes are to update language consistent with changes made by Lions Clubs International, these Proposed Changes include a multi-year increase in District Per Capita Tax (or dues) that, if passed, will be effective January 1, 2024. Dues will increase from \$10 per year to \$14 per year by July 1st, 2025. The District Per Capita Convention Fund Tax would see a one-time increase from \$1 to \$2 per member. These increases are necessary due to declining membership and increasing costs.

23 – 24 Proposed to changes to District 45 Constitution and By-Laws

*** All references to Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer includes the positions of Cabinet Secretary and Cabinet Treasurer. But it needs to be noted some Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer reference might need to be referenced as Cabinet Secretary or Cabinet Treasurer depending on what is being referenced. ***

For example, the following: Article 4, Section 1 paragraph a: Add (or Cabinet Secretary / Cabinet Treasurer) after the term: a Cabinet Secretary – Treasurer. Or the following: Article 4, Section 2 paragraph b: Add (or Cabinet Secretary) after the term Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer

Constitution:

Article 4, Section 1 paragraph b: Add (<u>if the Region Chair position is utilized</u>) after the phrase – one Region Chair for each Region.

Article 4, Section 4 paragraph d: Add sentence: <u>Audit must be completed</u>, in full, within 30 days of the <u>completion of the International Convention</u>. Any delay needs to be approved by the audit committee and/or honorary committee (other than outgoing and incoming DG).

Article 5, Section 1: Update the District Administrative Fund Per Capita Tax from \$10 which is assessed per six months at \$5 July 1 and January 1, effective January 1, 2024 to be \$6, effective July 1, 2024 to be \$6.50 (\$13 per year) and as of July 1, 2025 to be \$7 (\$14 per year) and will remain at \$14 as of 7/1/2025 unless further adjusted as approved.

Article 5, Section 1: Add the phrase: <u>Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer</u> (or <u>Cabinet Treasurer</u>) must issue an <u>invoice to District Club Treasurers</u> within 30 days of the International Convention for dues for the July 1 – December 30 period and by January 31st for the January 1 – June 30 period.

<u>Article 7, Secion 1: Update the Per Capita District Convention Fund Tax from \$1.00 to \$2.00 effective</u>
<u>January 1, 2024.</u>

BY-LAWS:

Article 2, Section 1, first sentence: ADD Global Action Team after 1st and second vice district governor.

Article 2, Section 1, first sentence: Add (if utilized) after region chairperson.

Article 2, Section 6, 1st sentence: Add <u>a Lion cannot serve as a Zone Chairperson for no more than three years, whether consecutively or in single years. A Past District Governor cannot serve as a Zone Chairperson.</u>

Article V: Change word Second <u>to be Third</u>, representing Third International Vice President. All other remaining wording remains the same.

Article V, Section 1, paragraph a: add (or a district cabinet meeting) after the term Fall Conference.

Article VIII: Add line: Constitution and By-laws were updated as of (Fall Conference / Spring Convention) October 2023.
