












Peace Poster Contest – Fall 2024 will be here soon!

For peace to be anything more than a possibility, we need to make it a priority. This year, we're asking our young students to create a poster that speaks to our world's infinite potential for kindness once we commit to pursuing the idea of peace without limits.

Students ages 11, 12 or 13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate in the International Peace Poster Contest. Entries not meeting the following deadlines will be disqualified.

- January 15: Kits go on sale from the Club Supplies Sales Department at International Headquarters.
- October 1: Deadline to purchase kits from the Club Supplies Sales Department at International Headquarters.
- November 15: Postmark deadline for a club to send one winning poster (per contest sponsored) to the district governor.
- December 1: Postmark deadline for a district governor to send one winning district poster to multiple district council chairperson.
- December 1: Postmark deadline for a district governor not belonging to a

- multiple district to send one winning poster to the Brand & Creative Department at International Headquarters.
- December 1: Postmark deadline for a club not belonging to a district to send one winning entry to the Brand & Creative Department at International Headquarters.
- December 15: Postmark deadline for the multiple district council chairperson to send one winning poster to the Brand & Creative Department at International Headquarters.
- **February 1:** International winners notified on or before this date.

Vision Screening Report



After working to obtain new vision screeners, there is finally light at the end of the tunnel. Lion Bruce has been working very hard to collect the five old SPOT screeners and is almost ready to ship them out to Plusoptics for their trade-in value. New USB converter cables have been ordered and received to go with each camera and three new printers came in this very morning.

After discussions with various clubs, the locations for these new cameras have been determined. The new cameras will be going to Troy, Arlington, Deerfield, Champlain Valley, and Heartland. These locations were chosen after extensive discussions with various clubs as well as considerations to having them located in the most accessible locations to benefit as many surrounding towns as possible.

Some clubs were very vocal about their choice of vision screener, which was taken into consideration when planning the placements of the Plusoptix brand screeners. Those who wanted to stay with the SPOT screener will still use those screeners while those clubs that were willing to accept the Plusoptix screeners will receive the new cameras shortly.

Training for the new screeners will be held sometime in February. As soon as all the new cameras are in place, ZOOM training will be set up so members can see and handle the actual screener while being taught how to best operate them. Thank you to my Springfield club for helping me figure out the best way to organize such a daunting project!

With that all being said, I am very happy to announce that District 45 has screened 15075 students so far this Lion year with 1681 referrals being made. There will still be a few more screenings being performed so a final total isn't available yet, but what a great job you have all done!

Finally, I would like to take this moment to thank my wonderful husband, PCST Bruce, for being willing to take on the task of being Co-Coordinator with me during my year as District Governor. He has been very busy with emails and phone calls (as many of you know) in preparation for the arrival of the new screeners and collecting the old ones for the trade-in allowance. He will be collecting all the reports over the next year and assisting clubs with any issues that may pop up, as they inevitably do. Thank you, Bruce. Now with 11 good screeners, we are hoping that the problems of breakdowns will be minimal this year and the new year will go much smoother.
