#### Plunder Bay Open Rules and Format

#### 6:30AM Take Off

- 1. Fishing for 6 fish. 12" minimum: length. No live bait, artificial lures only.
- All boats must be at least 14 ft long and have a working live well and kill switch.
- All boats must carry a minimum of \$300,000 in liability insurance.
- All anglers must wear a U.S.C.G approved life jacket whenever the main engine is in gear (kill switch attached).
- Nets are permitted.
- 6. Take off and Weigh-in will be at Plunder Bay marina at the announced times.
- Boaters take off position will be by random drawing for those applications received by the Thursday before the announced date of the tournament. All other applicants will be positioned by the time they are received.
- Applications will be accepted the morning of the tournament up to 6:00am.
   Save time and bring your completed form and a check for \$175 to registration.
   (\$25 late fee)
- Boaters may launch from any boat launch but take off and weigh-in will be at Plunder Bay.
- If coming by boat, you still must pick up your take off number, flight number and your check in time at the registration table.
- Take off will be from the end of the Plunder Bay Marina dock. As you pass by the dock have the live well lids open and the pumps turned on.
- Next, idle out towards the main lake about 5-10 boat lengths and pull the kill switch for a safety check. Replace the kill switch and idle to designated spot to get on plane. Please proceed safely.
- Check in times will be provided at the registration table. Any boat arriving late for their check in time will receive a 1 lb. per minute deduction with disqualification after 10 min.
- 14. Please do not bring your fish to the weigh-in until your flight number has been called. Do not use a personal bag for bagging your fish. Bags will be provided to the first flight and collected after their fish are weighed in.
- Minimum length is 12" measured closed mouth to closed tail. No courtesy checks. Penalty for bringing a short fish to the scale will be a 1 pound deduction from the Teams total weight of the other 5 fish.
- Anglers may not cull a dead fish. Each dead fish brought to the scale will result in 1 pound penalty. A dead fish can not be entered for the Lunker Prize.
- In the event of a tie for Total Weight, the team with the most fish wins. If still
  tied, the Team with the most live fish wins, followed by the heaviest single fish,
  then an equal split.
- 18. All contestants are to follow high standards of sportsmanship and courtesy at all times including complying with all boating and fishing regulations for Lake Champlain. No alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs shall be in the boat or at weigh-in area during the tournament hours. Drunkenness shall be grounds for disqualification.
- All protests must be filed with the tournament committee before the start of the weigh-in. The decision of the committee shall be final.

# Eye Glass Recycling Instructions


We need your assistance again. At the last Cabinet meeting clubs did a terrific job turning in their eyeglasses for recycling, but we made work for the Vergennes Lions because not all clubs prepped their donations as necessary.

- We want eyeglasses not cases. Remove any eyeglass cases and discard or recycle the cases. We only need the eyeglasses to be turned in.
- 2) Write your FULL Club Name and the count of glasses in the box on the outside of the box. These boxes will be transported in the back of a pickup at 72 mph...any loose note will be blown away...and at least one was.
- 3) Seal the box firmly for transport. The box will not be opened until it gets to New Jersey so ensure that only glasses are inside.

Finally many folks were asking for an address so that they could hand deliver their glasses. The district's glasses are being consolidated at Lion Brad Howe's home in Vergennes. The physical address (not the mailing address) is 125 Sunset Knoll, Vergennes, VT. Please call Brad at 802-759-2141 prior to delivering to ensure that he will be there to receive.

Lion Randy from Middlebury Lions will continue to transport glasses from cabinet meetings to Brad's home, so feel free to continue to bring them to cabinet meetings.
