A Fleeting Animal:

An Opera From Judevine, is a collaboration between Vermont poet/playwright David Budbill and Vermont composer Erik Nielsen. It is the tragic love story of Tommy, a recently returned veteran, and Grace, a struggling and misunderstood single mother in a small Northeast Kingdom town. Tommy is supported by two visiting army buddies and his wise and humorous friend Antoine. The characters in the rich cast leap straight from the often muddy and messy roads of rural Vermont life.

A Fleeting Animal is timeless in its themes: the harm of individual isolation and the possibility of community redemption. Like all great operas, it has passion, humor, and tragedy. With its earthy characters and libretto and music inspired by French Canadian fiddle tunes, the blues, jazz, and other contemporary styles, A Fleeting Animal appeals to a broad audience, including those who wouldn't normally attend an opera.

Ending veteran homelessness by 31 December 2015 is a presidential initiative. Vermont Veterans Services at the University of Vermont (VVS) is a Veterans Administration (VA) Supportive Services for Veterans and Families (SSVF) grantee that is a major part of this initiative.

In Vermont all of the VA programs, State agencies and not-for-profits are working together toward this goal. The first objective is to locate homeless veterans, the second objective is to let them know the help that is available, and the final objective is to help all homeless veterans who want help to find permanent housing.

Vermont Veteran Services team members are literally going into the woods to find and talk with veterans. We are visiting shelters, food shelves and any place we might come into contact with veterans who may need help. What we need are more eyes and ears all over Vermont who could let us know where to look. The other day we heard from one of the members of the National Guard Combat Veterans Outreach Team about several locations where veterans are living rough. This spring we met a veteran at the Stand Down at Lyndon State who helps support a large group of veterans living rough in the Northeast Kingdom.

Calls from homeless families to 211 are up 8% over last year, and some of these people are certainly members of veteran families. We need you to call 802-656-3232 or email info@vermontveteransservices.org if you have any information that may help us locate literally homeless veterans who served from WWII to the present.

The support we need now is to have you looking out for your neighbors.
