




MyLion Action Plan for **Lions Clubs Leaders**

Changing the world just got easier with MyLion, the free mobile app that helps Lions connect at the club level and beyond. As a club or district leader, Lions Clubs International is relying on you to start using the MyLion mobile app and inspire other members to do the same.

Download MyLion at MyLion.org.

Once it's on your smartphone or tablet, you'll see how MyLion can make your role as an officer easier, from reaching your entire membership instantly to sharing your successes around the world.



It's easy! All you need is a photo and short bio. Just follow the instructions in the app, or link to these blog posts for extra help:

• How can I edit my Club's MyLion profile?

Verify MyLCI contact information.

Make sure all member email addresses, phone numbers, and street addresses are up to date.

Designate a MyLion advocate.

Put someone in charge of making sure all your members download and use MyLion. This person doesn't need technical expertise, just a general knowledge about MyLion and how to download it on a compatible smartphone or tablet.



Start telling your members to use the app.

Make it even easier for them by providing them with their Member ID, which is required for registration as a member. You can also sign in as a guest.

Call a special MyLion meeting.
