VERMONT LIONS CHARITIES Cabinet Meeting report - American Legion/Middlebury Saturday, March 16, 2019

Good morning: This report will provide an up-date on LVC activity for January & February and more importantly provide our progress in assisting those Vermont families dealing with pediatric cancer.

At our meeting this morning we finalized and approved our budget for 2019. We established our income for the year at \$51,900.00 and on the expense side, \$56,950.00. On the income side, we hope to raise, via fundraisers and donations, approx. \$43,250.00 while on the expense side distribute \$17,500.00 in eyeglass expense, \$11,500.00 in vision screening and in other areas such as grants/scholarships and misc., a total of \$27,950.00. More than \$10,000.00 of this expense will be in the areas of pediatric cancer.

At this point in time, we have made our yearly distribution of \$1,500.00 to Vt. Adaptive Sports, provided \$3,500.00 in the area of stipends to our families dealing with pediatric cancer and have provided \$10,500.00 in the area of general assistance. (\$5,000 to the family of the 12-year-old having the rare gene mutation KCTD7 and \$5,000.00 to the family where their two-year-old is in need of a service dog as the child is now legally blind.

In Concluding this report, here is the latest up-date on our efforts in assisting those Vermont families dealing with pediatric cancer. We have received (7) requests for the \$500 stipends and yes, supported all the request: (1) from the Children's Hospital of Albany, (3) via Dartmouth-Hitchcock and (4) from the University of Vermont Children's Hospital. Their age ranges: (5) months to (18) and from Springfield, Brownsville, Lyndonville, South Londonderry, Brandon, Barre and South Burlington.

THANK YOU so much to all who supported the VLC February Cash Fest Raffle.

Proceeds from this raffle will help Vermont Lions Charities to continue to support the KidsSight USA Vision Screening Program along with other Sight and Hearing needs within District 45 and continue to SERVE those in need.



Nutritionally, peanut butter is high in protein, potassium, magnesium and heart healthy fats. And what is a peanut butter sandwich without jelly?
