The program, in its first year, asks for volunteers to teach, weed, plant, and harvest more than two acres of vegetables in this great effort.

### Lions Club Peace Poster Contest

You've heard lots about the LCI Peace Posters over the years. Members will remember DG Bruce Bushey bringing a winning poster to your club last year. It's a great project to get youth involved in Lions activities, encourage art in our schools and keep Lions in the forefront of our

communities.



This was an award winner in the international contest in 2010. All the details of the contest are on the Lions Club International web site. Before we get to the LCI contest however, there is a contest for Vermont Lions Clubs

sponsorship.

The contest is open to students aged 11 to 13 on November 15, 2010. The contest visually depicts, the theme, *Vision of Peace*. One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district level for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected and sent to International headquarters for final judging. Entries are judged on levels of originality, artistic merit and portrayal of the theme. During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

Lions Clubs need to order a Peace Poster Contest Kit from the Club Supplies division at LCI, the cost is \$9.95. Each kit has everything you need to sponsor one school or organized youth group. Kits are available now until October 1 so order soon to be ready.

## **Vermont Lions Charities Report**

Fellow Lions,

At our Vermont Lions Charities board meeting in St. Johnsbury on August 21, the board approved a grant of up to \$19,200 to help pay for the bath house facility at the Vermont Lions-Austine Camp for the Hearing Impaired in Brattleboro. Also approved was a \$2000 grant to the Vermont Association for the Blind to provide large print calendars.

The Jericho-Underhill Lions applied for and received \$1,250, to help them purchase hearing aids for two community members. Finally, the Board approved a \$500 donation to *The Veterans Place*, a community based non-profit transitional housing program for homeless veterans in Northfield.

We also purchased several pairs of eyeglasses for Vermonters not living in an area covered by a local Lions club.

The 2010 Vermont Lions Big Dine Out Raffle is underway. Tickets have been distributed to clubs in all four regions. Details of how it works were in the July Communiqué, but briefly, each of the four regions solicited 15 of their top restaurants, purchasing a \$50 gift certificate with the restaurant donating two \$25 gift certificates. There will be one winner of all \$50 gift cards in each region. All \$25 cards will be drawn individually as 30 second prizes per region. If every Vermont Lion purchased one ticket, the VLC would net nearly \$25,000 to continue our work. **We Serve**.

The drawings will take place at the October Fall Conference in Killington. When your club presents the tickets, please take part and help your organization continue its great service to Vermonters.

Every Lion who sells five or more tickets will be entered into a drawing for a free weekend at the District Convention at the Equinox House in Manchester, next April.
