Condolences to the family and friends of PDG Dick Munsell

Past District Governor Dick Munsell, 80, of Williston passed away suddenly on June 5. Dick was a long time member of

the Essex Jct. Lions Club. He served as District Governor in 1991-92. He and his wife, Marion, were married for more than 55 years. Dick was an Army veteran who had served two tours of duty in Viet Nam. He was very active in several organizations, including the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

He served for many years as chair of the Lions Twin-State Soccer program and continued to serve on the board of directors. Besides his wife, he is survived by three sons and their families. Services were held on June 9 in Essex Junction, with burial in the National Veterans Cemetary in Randolph. Contributions in his memory should be made to the District 45 Sight and Hearing Fund, care of Vermont Lions Charities.

New Members Need Duties

Getting new members is not easy, but once they have been asked to join, and they say yes, induct that new member and make them an important part of the club.
