Tropical Storm Irene



We've all seen the pictures of the aftermath of the worst flooding that Vermont has seen since 1938, all thanks to Tropical Storm Irene. Our state has been ravaged and left a great many people in need, including some of our fellow Lions. Many of our roads and bridges were washed out,

leaving some communities cut off from the rest of the world via normal means of transport. Houses and businesses suffered major damage or were completely destroyed.

Nevertheless, when tragedy strikes, that's when Lions do what comes naturally. We Serve. DG Steve Simpson and PDG Sherry Lee Juaire secured a \$10,000.00 grant from LCIF to help supply food, water, blankets, medications, soap, toothpaste and clothing to Irene's victims.

Clubs and communities that weren't greatly affected by the storm rallied to help. The Vergennes Club secured a trailer to collect supplies to deliver to the Rutland area. Using a list based on the Food From the Heart drive, they collected food and personal supplies, enough to fill the trailer nearly ³/₄ full by the end of their collection. That combined with the \$1,000.00 they were able to collect, they have made miracles happen.



The Barre Club jumped into action as well. They worked with local vendors to provide food and needed supplies to communities in need. They secured vouchers with Aubuchon's for clean-up supplies to give to qualified people. A local food wholesaler worked with the club to put together boxes of food in water for distribution through a flood relief center or handed out in the affected neighborhoods. They put together packets of goods and necessities purchases at a dollar store and even arranged with a local grocery store to provide a number of food vouchers.

Even Lions North of the border, in Cowansville, Quebec were called to action and offered assistance to D-45.

These are great examples of what Lionism is all about. It is truly impressive what we can do when we band together for a common goal.

It'll be a long time before Vermont has fully recovered from the effects of Tropical Storm Irene. Lions aren't going anywhere though. We will always be here to Serve those in need.
