

Believe it on not: Filing Tax Forms is a Yearly Requirement – Even for Lions Clubs

It is not hard to guess what would happen if you did not file your tax forms by April 15th every year; you would receive letters from the Internal Revenue Service, late filing penalties, and maybe miss out on your tax refund. The same things can (and will) happen to your Lions Club if they do not file their tax form.

Lions Clubs have an obligation to file a yearly tax form – actually the IRS calls it an "Information Form" (no taxes are involved), but yearly filing is required and IRS letters, penalties, and even loss of the Clubs non-profit status will result from not filing these forms. According to IRS resources – over 75% of District 45 (Vermont) Lions Clubs are not current on filing these required forms.

The form that you club needs to file depends upon its Gross Income for the Clubs Fiscal year:

Fiscal Year Income	Form to File
Gross receipts normally ≤ \$50,000	<u>990-N</u>
Gross receipts < \$200,000, and Total assets < \$500,000	990-EZ or 990
Gross receipts ≥ \$200,000, or Total assets ≥ \$500,000	990

Most Clubs should be able to file Form 990-N. This form just asks for three things; Club's current address, the name and address of a current Club officer, and confirmation that the Club normally has less then \$50,000 in gross income. The 990-N Form can only be filed on-line (http://epostcard.form990.org/).

The 990-EZ Form is very straightforward to fill out. This form asks for financial information in addition to the club's contact information. Avoid the 990 Form if you can. The 990 and 990-EZ Forms can be filled out on line (http://efile.form990.org/) or on paper (http://www.irs.gov/app/picklist/list/formsPublications.html?value=990&criteria=formNumber).

Lion Kerry Claffey of the Strafford Area Lions and CopperHill Tax Services has volunteered to assist clubs in filing these forms. IF you have questions on filling out of filing any of these forms, contact Lion Kerry at CopperHill@myfairpoint.net or 802-765-4019.

Due dates for these IRS forms are $5\frac{1}{2}$ months after the close of the Club's Fiscal Year (November 15^{th} for Clubs that have a year ending on June 30^{th}). If you have not filed a form for you last fiscal year, DO IT NOW, it is better to file these forms late then not to file them at all.
