Christmas trees and preparing them for a mulch making project. For many year the Lions in several Vermont clubs have been hosting a Christmas tree recycling day, in Vergennes the Lions get together for a cold day of picking up trees all over the city and delivering them to the site. Borrowed pickups, a city truck, whatever it takes to get the job done quickly.

About two hours of cold weather work and then breakfast for all the volunteers, at a local restaurant makes for a fun time. It's a shared project with good Lion friendships. Probably more important is the community relations and visibility the members get for their hard work.

Getting the word out of the work of your Lions Club is necessary to recruiting new members. Your citizens need to know the Lions are out there working in the community. Wear your Lions vests, be visible, carry out projects that will allow the community to understand the work of Lions, and invite them to join you.

Your local newspapers will often carry Lions related stories if you present the story to them in a way that is usable. Meet your editor, meet your reporters. Stop by the newspaper office and introduce yourself, and Lions. The editor is also a potential Lion. Invite the newspaper folks to a Lions event or meeting. Make sure they are properly introduced around and know who the members are. You have to peak their interest, and show that Lions are an important part of the community. The same goes for any potential member, show them the work of Lions and your importance in community service. It works.

Don't say you don't have enough time. You have the same number of hours in a day that were given to Helen Keller, Michaelangelo, Mother Teresa, Thomas Jefferson, Albert Einstein and other world wonders.

Food from the Heart

The D-45 Food from the Heart program, chaired by Lion Tom Broughton, has become a terrific success with many clubs participating. As of this writing, 13 clubs have reported their participation. Over eight tons of



food has been collected and delivered to food shelves in their areas. They also report more than \$6,000 in cash donations to this Lions service project. This is another very visible project to show the valuable work of Lions in your community.
