Whitingham-Halifax Lions are spinning their Wheels ... for Meals!

The Hungry Lion Bike Tour returns for a second year to Southern Vermont's Deerfield Valley on Saturday, September 28th. Cyclists will enjoy our amazing fall foliage while raising funds to help end hunger in Southern Vermont. This year's tour includes three routes: a 32 mile "tour," a 55 mile "flyer," and a 75 mile "challenge." And each ride is designed to challenge both new and experienced cyclists.

How did the Hungry Lion come about?

Last year, several of the members of the Whitingham-Halifax club discovered that they all loved bicycling. They had raced, bicycled crossed North America, lead inn-to-inn trips for Vermont Bicycle Touring, and even bicycled in fundraisers. This inspired a solution to the problem of how to fund the club's largest expense, the holiday food baskets project. Lion Joe Specht took the Lion by the tail and came up with the solution: hold a fall foliage bike tour and have friends sponsor the riders. To draw the maximum amount of cyclists, Lion Joe and his committee planned extra incentives. For instance, at the midride rest stop in beautiful Zoar, Massachusetts, picnic benches await the riders with loads of high-energy food, thanks to The Richards Group's (an insurance and financial planning company) funding to the tune of \$500.00. When riders return to Town Hill in Whitingham, a massage therapist is there to help overcome any aches and tension. And while waiting their turn, each rider gets to refill their calorie deficiency with a delicious barbeque, prepared by fellow Lions. (continued on page 3)

Finally, participants –including those who have fundraised the most – are given many great donated prizes at the concluding ceremony, including gift certificates to local eateries, cycling apparel, and even lift tickets to Mount Snow.

So, what is the meals part of the equation, and where do the funds go?

For many decades, the Whitingham-Halifax Lions have taken care of their neighbors in need during the holidays. The club began by delivering hot meals at Christmastime. But one meal certainly fell short of the need. So now, the club partners with the Vermont Food Bank to buy literally tons of food at the lowest possible cost. On the Saturday before Christmas, club members stalk the valley like Lion Santas. They deliver reusable grocery bag after overstuffed bag to families most in need – folks out of work, or victims of illness or accidents, or seniors.

The Lions Holiday Baskets program is a totally heartwarming experience for giver and recipient alike, and makes a huge difference to help vulnerable people over the early winter hump, filling their cupboards with essential foods that will last for weeks.

After Hurricane Irene devastated the area, the Lions brought the Deerfield Valley Rotary, an equally strong club, on board – and with that outreach, the club effectively expanded coverage to ten surrounding towns. Many people are still not aware that hunger and food insecurity are a fact of life for 12% of Vermonters. And it takes all hands on deck. Today, "We Serve" over 400 individuals most in need, locally. As Whitingham-Halifax Lion Mark Hanna was quoted in the January 2011 Lions Communiqué, "Every year the demand goes up, and every year we meet it."

Financial donations are critical!

All this takes money. The club has been fortunate to have a great benefactor, TransCanada, which funds the event with up to \$2,000 each year. But, given the need, that doesn't go so far anymore. To help make up the expanding need, the 2012 Hungry Lion raised in excess of \$4,000. This year, with help, the Lions hope to increase that amount 50%.

Please join in, and spin your own wheels!

People need not pedal to participate. Sponsor a Lion, or just sponsor the event. Make others – especially cyclists – aware of the Hungry Lion by sharing the website. But if you can pedal 32 miles or more, please join us for scenic foliage riding on country back roads – and some Vermont Lion camaraderie.



meetings if so desired. Buying a pin supports the district, and I encourage Lions to pitch in.



Fellow Lions of Vermont District 45,

The first meeting of the Vermont Lions year, 2013 - 2014, of Vermont Lions Charities (VLC), was held recently at the Cabinet Meeting in Chester.

A very strong discussion was held on how VLC can continue to meet the requests of Clubs of District 45 but also the keep up with the requests of residents of the State of Vermont that are without a Lions Club in their community. With the efforts of Lion Linda Eastman and Lion Carmelita Belisle, Co-Chairs of Vermont Lions District 45, and their assistants, Lions Connie LaPlumme of the Troy and Area club, Lion George Norfleet of the Springfield Lions Club and Lion Sally Wilder of the St. Johnsbury and Area club, we believe we will be able to handle the task ahead of us.

The board approved assistance for the Jericho Underhill Lions Club for a resident of need, reviewed a request for two other clubs for financial assistance of which both were tabled until more information was available. We also received a request from Lion Travis Lebel, co-chair of the Nellie Hart Memorial Award which was tabled until the October meeting.

At DG Tommy's Fall Conference, Saturday October 19th, VLC will hold its annual meeting. More on this can be found elsewhere in the Communique.

I want to bring to your attention the present fundraiser that VLC is hosting. The 'Big Dine Out Raffle". By now, all club presidents should have received tickets for this year's event. D45 Traveling Lions

District 45 has a long standing contest called the District 45 Traveling Lion Contest.

For new Lions (or anyone who's interested), I'll summarize*: The idea of this contest is to capture the Region Lion or District Lion. That Lion (it's actually a very cute and cuddly stuffed lion toy) is held by the last club to win it (this club is called the Host Club). To capture that Lion, another club from the Region (in the case of the Regional Lion) or the District sends its members "traveling" to the Host Club on a date specified by the Host Club. Each traveling club gets points which are calculated taking into account the size of the traveling club, the number of traveling members, and the distance traveled. The traveling club with the most points takes home the Lion, becoming the Host Club in turn.


