Here it is the middle of June and my time as District Governor is almost over. I also want to thank each and every Lions member of District 45 for everything that they have done over the past year. We have had many challenges put to us and many of you kept believing and making dreams come true. Keep up the great work.

One of the things that was asked several times over my visits and meetings is what makes a District. According to Lions International Bylaws is that a District must have 35 clubs and 1250 members to be a single district. As of right now we have 39 clubs with one in Status Quo due to non-payment of bills to International and 2 more in jeopardy which would bring that number down to 36. Dues are due to International twice a year in July and in January and if you buy supplies from International you have 90 days to pay this off to stay current with International. A few clubs are forgetting that dues are due twice a year.

But where we are having issues is with membership. I know that we have many clubs out there bringing in new members but we are losing more by not retaining them. Currently we are at 1225 members so it is important that we use mentoring to maintain membership. Also for those clubs that have new members but yet have entered them with International please do so. By not entering them with International you are putting them in jeopardy as they will not be covered as Lions and could turn into a situation for your clubs.

Again I want to thank each of you for allowing me to be your District Governor and hope that each of you will continue the support for DG Elect Bob Wilcox and 1st VDG Elect Tommy Walz.

The fifth annual Vermont Lions Charities Walkathon has come and gone. The 2012 version was a great success. 77 attendees, approximately 1,155 laps around the Vermont State Fairgrounds midway (equals about 231 miles) and \$15,000 raised. I want to offer a great big THANK YOU to everyone who either participated or made a donation. And I would like to also offer a double great big THANK YOU THANK YOU to the Walkathon committee. Looking forward to 2013.

Couple of things I would like to point out. This year, the walkers were walking for two purposes: Vermont Lions Charities and their own choice. Monies were raised for: Vermont Lions Charities Shared Vision Fund, Lion Rick Dutil's Memorial Scholarship, Makea-Wish, V A B V I, Addison County Humane Society, The Veterans Place and the clubs of Castleton, Brandon ForestDale, Norshaft, Pittsford and Jericho-Underhill. Please let me know your thoughts if this 'style of fundraising' is something we should try again in 2013 or not.

The other item is that I am looking into hosting a second location for a Walkathon the same day. The Rutland location is a good central location but I am hoping that maybe my friends from Region 4 can help me find a location in their area as well. Will keep you posted.

The demand for Vermont Lions Charities is very high, especially in the areas where there are no Lions Clubs. In the first 4 months of 2013, we have paid out approximately \$6,000 to help Vermont residents in the areas like: Brattleboro, Morrisville, St. Albans, Randolph. And that is just for eyeglasses. Does not include other assistance that VLC has offered in purchasing hearing aids or visual aids for youths throughout the state.

So I am asking the clubs of Vermont Lions District 45, as you are making your financial plans for the upcoming 2012 - 2013 Lions year, please keep Vermont Lions Charities in your plans. Both to make a donation but also that VLC is YOUR 501 (c) (3) arm to receive donations for your club as well. With everyone looking for that 'tax donation' for their own taxes, don't forget you can offer them the knowledge of knowing a donation to your club can be a 'tax donation'.

Please be watching for information on the VLC 'Big Dine Out' Raffle, which should be coming out in August.

Official Minutes of Business Meeting Vermont Lions District 45 – Spring Convention May 19, 2012, Jay Peak Resort, Jay, VT

Meeting called to order by District Governor Steve Simpson at 2:00 p.m.

Roll Call of Clubs: C S/T Ken Emery: 112 in attendance, plus PID Bud and Lion Jama Wahl, plus 43 guests, representing 22 of the District's 39 clubs. There was no Leos attending from the 4 Leo Clubs in the District.

Minutes of the 4th Cabinet Meeting: C S/T Ken Emery – Moved to accept by Lion Lyle Remick of Burlington Lions Club, 2nd by Lion Stanley Bizon of Pittsford Lions Club Motion was passed.

Financial Reports: C S/T Ken Emery presented the budget for 2011 - 2012. Motion to accept by Lion Lyle Remick (Burlington Lions Club), 2^{nd} by Lion Stanley Bizon, Pittsford Lions Club. C S/T Ken indicated that back in January, the books had to be audited which was done in February. The transfer of books is planned for July 7 at VDG Bob Wilcox's camp at Lake St. Catherine. Motion was passed.

State of the District – DG Steve Simpson: Discussed the state of membership, now at 1248 and clubs now at 39 clubs. To be a viable district we need to have 1250 members. Discussed all the Lions in Vermont helping out with Tropical Storm Irene. Thank you to Troy and Area for hosting the Spring Convention.

\$2,000 for the All State Music Festival. Mentioned that even though Vermont Lions has been a strong supporter of All State Music Festival but next year we might not be able to support as much as we have greater needs for other places. Over \$3,000 for hearing and visual needs – Ludlow, Hartland, Bennington.

Successful Walkathon this past Saturday. Talked about Lion Rob Keith walking 12 miles. 77 walkers. 231 miles walking. Otter Leo walked 9 miles. Raised approximately \$14,000 with approximately \$8,500 staying with VLC. Discussed where some of the other areas funds are going to. One goal is adding a second location for the Walkathon especially in Region 4 to encourage more participation. Second sight would be the very same day. Expand our reach. Looking again at Mother Day's weekend in 2013.

Did grand prize for anyone who raised \$100: 1st prize being Orvis Rod and Reel won by Lion Jackie Dutil, 2nd prize Dakin's Gift Basket won by Lion Rob Keith, and \$50 gift certificate to Sarducci's won by PID Tom Broughton.

Lion Loreen Teer, on behalf of Jericho Underhill Lions Club, had drawing for the Quilt donated by local resident with funds going to Lion Rick Dutil Memorial Scholarship, amount of \$610 with winner being Lion Gary Gorton of Brandon ForestDale Lions Club.

Monies donated by Swanton Mississquoi \$100, and Pittsford Lions Club - \$8 coin jar.

Sight and Hearing – Lion Linda Eastman and Carmelita Belisle: Lion Linda discussed the number of calls being received, 156 calls between mid March to Mid May. 9 applications via website. Thanks to everyone to accept. Discussed the Art at Hand project going on at Shelburne Museum. DG Steve gave Thank you's to both Lion Linda and Lion Carmelita.

Fund Raising – PDG Betsy MaGee: Announced that Lions Loreen Teer and Cindy Berg have agreed to take on the Fund Raising program in 2012 – 2013. Silent Auction took in \$399, 200 club took in \$50. 200 club winners were: \$50 PDG Ken Ellis, \$25 Lion Ody Laroche, \$10 Lion Harry Hinrichsen, \$5 Lion Mary Kerner, \$5 PDG Mel Coburn and \$5 Lion Erin Connors. 50/50 drawn at the MJF Luncheon raised \$90 to winner. Thank you from DG Steve to Lion David.

Traveling Lions Contest: PCST Debbie Bushey presented awards from Region 1 Traveling Lion: 3^{rd} place Colchester, 2^{nd} place Essex Jct. and 1^{st} place being Jericho-Underhill. Region 2 traveling Lion was 3^{rd} place Brandon Forest Dale, 2^{nd} place Castleton and 1^{st} place being Vergennes. For District Traveling Lion it was 3^{rd} place Colchester Lions, 2^{nd} place Brandon Forest Dale and 1^{st} place was Vergennes. No awards was given for Regions 3 and 4. Thank you from DG Steve.

Nomination for Vice District Governor Candidate Lion Tommy Walz was made by King Lion Mark Tatro of the Barre Lions Club, along with a wonderous rendition of a song in honor of Lion Tommy Walz by all Barre Lions Clubs members in attendance., 2nd of Nomination was made by PDG Bill Moulton of St. Johnsbury Lions Club. Motion was made and past for CST Ken Emery to submit written ballot in favor of Lion Tommy Walz to be Vice District Governor of Vermont Lions District 45 in 2012 – 2013.

Both DGE Bob Wilcox and VDGE Tommy Walz gave thank you speechs and looking forward to the coming year.
