Granville, NY Request

To the members of District 45,

The Granville New York Lions Club, present members of District 20 Y 2 have approached the leadership of District 45 to become part of District 45.

For this to be accomplished, there is a 3 step process. The first step is that the club itself, needs to vote on such request to leave District 20 Y 2 and join District 45. This has been done and a formal letter, with copy of such resolution, has been received by the District 45 leadership.

The second step is a 2 part process. Both the District Governor of District 45 and District 20 Y 2 must approve such request and that the District membership must vote at their District Conventions to allow such to be done. I understand that District Governor Joe has been in discussion with the District Governor for 20 Y 2 in regards to this subject, both for approval of the District Governor and the District membership.

For District 45 membership to approve such, the District 45 by-law's need to be updated to reflect the boundaries of District 45. Presently, the boundary for District 45 is the borders of the State of Vermont. At the Fall Conference, we will vote on changing the boundary for District 45 to include the service area for the Granville NY Lions.

The third and final step is that once approval is received from both Districts and District Governors, such approvals are forwarded to Lions Club International for their review. And is such review approves of the change, then the Granville NY Lions would then become part of District 45.

Please note, in this communique, is a 'formal' notice of a vote of change of District 45 By-laws to be held at the Fall Conference, Saturday October 22nd. Formal notice will also be sent to each club's president and secretary to review with the club membership.

- 19. Quorum: At least five (5) Directors must be present to conduct business; except to adjourn the meeting.
- 20. Emergency grants may be made by the executive committee only in the amounts approved previously by the Board of Directors.

Proposed changes:

- 18. All grants may be approved either by a majority of the Board of Directors present at the meeting or if that matter needs immediate attention, a discussion and vote may be taken by email.
- 19. Quorum: At least (5) Directors must either be present at a meeting or participate in an email discussion and vote in order to conduct business; except to adjourn the meeting.
- 20. Emergency grants may be approved by the executive committee only in the amounts approved previously by the Board of Directors. Emergency grants in amounts previously approved by the Board of Directors will require a quorum of email participation.
