September 2022 Vision Screening Report

It's that time again when children head off back to school and Lions get ready for vision screening. It is hoped that this year will run much smoother with Covid under better control, but we are ready...

I just want to remind our Visioneers to send their reports to the district for credit as a Service Project and to me so I can report to KidSight the wonderful work District 45 does. I also wish to remind the clubs who lend their cameras to the nurses, to report those results as well. It can make a huge difference at the end of the year, and you are entitled to that credit.

Please, also, when a club is done with the use of a camera, return it to the host club promptly. If it isn't possible to return it within two weeks of use, it is important that the host Coordinator at least know where that camera is should a need arise. This courtesy should also be observed when borrowing a club-owned camera.

In the past I did not ask for the ages of each group that Visioneers screened. I am now doing so for me to be able to report to KidSight USA properly. I need the number of children screened by ages. This is statistical data they collect for monitoring purposes. I've sent our information to them as best I could in the past, but now I think we do enough screenings that I need to be more exact with the information I submit. I know this will mean a little more attention to detail, but if you have been asking the ages of each child like the camera prompts, all that information should be at your fingertips. Thank you in advance for doing this. I will be sharing this request a lot over the next few months so please bear with me.

I am truly hoping to send out, via email, a packet of things the clubs can use for informational purposes. Websites, write-ups, things that can be printed out, so stay tuned for this packet. It will be sent to the club secretaries to forward to each vision screening team.

Thank you in advance for all your hard work! I look forward to meeting with you all along the way, be at cabinet meetings, zone meetings or club visitations.

Marketing Matters

Tips & Ideas to Enhance Your Lions Club

September 2022 – Publicity for Lions Clubs – a group discussion

At the August D45 cabinet meeting, we asked Lions to open up about how their club promotes itself. Here are some of the great responses we got from the dozens of Lions who were there!

Why is publicity important for your club?

- A. Awareness enables us to connect with those who need our services. (*"I didn't know that Lions help with eyesight?"*)
- B. Use marketing to expand what we are doing, entice new members and revitalize our clubs with new projects. Also, helps getting long-time club members reinvolved in our programs.
- C. Community outreach benefits everyone when they become aware how we help their neighbors – using specific instances – and even helps ease our ability to fundraise.
- D. Multiplies the good our clubs offer the community. (Statistic: Each active member at a club positively effects 70 members in the community; and growing the club by just a few members makes a huge difference for our communities!)
- E. There are so many nonprofits in competition for volunteers that Lions need to stand out!
- F. It's imperative to let a wide audience know what Lions do in the community; display who Lions are, and that we give back to the community ... showing our purpose.

What examples do our Lions have of successes in marketing our clubs?

- 1. Free press releases to local Newspapers.
 - 2. With no local paper for the Upper Valley, the club connects with the town through the Town Manager's own newsletter.
 - 3. Front Porch Forum is a great way to get local information out to our community.
 - 4. "There is no secret ingredient," but **keeping at it and repetition** helps a lot.
 - 5. Roadside signage is very helpful. Signs of every type being displayed consistently.
 - 6. **Social media:** Don't rely on Facebook alone – younger people don't use it. Concentrate on **Instagram and Tik Tok**. Tick Tok is the hot place to put up short videos to promote your club and events. See: <https://www.tiktok.com>.
 - 7. Post cards in the mail.
 - 8. **Partnerships with other organizations-** block party- strolls- just being present.
 - 9. Space can be hard to find to put up full size posters on Bulletin Boards. **Skinny Rack Cards** take little room and quickly describe our programs. We put them out there at rest areas and lots of other locations where people gather – and folks can take them with them, too.
 - 10. At the Manchester Street Fest, the club puts **applications on tabletops**, and we get to hand them out to friends we find in the crowd.
 - 11. **Word of mouth:** Volunteer help is a struggle and word of mouth will encourage others to see what we do and impact membership.
 - 12. **Being there** at events like the Elf Express Train.
 - 13. Deerfield Valley's Hungry Lion Bike Tour – without **extensive marketing**, it would never have been as successful.
 - 14. **Assign specific Lions to promote on social media.** That can be their big contribution.
 - 15. It helps to hone your **Elevator Speech** (For when someone asks what do you do, and you have less than 90 seconds to gain their interest, for follow up discussions.)



FACULTY DEVELOPMENT INSTITUTE (FDI)

Greetings Lions!
The New England Lions Council (NELC) Leadership Team is excited to announce that a Faculty Development Institute (FDI) will be held on October 12-14, 2022 right here in New England. As a Lion leader, you know better than anyone the importance of future instructors and trainers. The future instructors selected will have a unique opportunity to attend this comprehensive learning, where they will develop skills critical to their future role as a leadership resource. They will leave the NELC-FDI full of the knowledge, confidence, and energy required to take participants in future training opportunities to higher levels.

The FDI is focused on building the skills of Lions members for leadership opportunities at the district, multiple district and international levels. Candidates must be Lions in good standing who have previously conducted Lions training or have taught outside of Lions. It is recommended, but not a requirement, that applicants have completed the Advanced Lions Leadership Institute (ALLI).

The FDI will be held at the Boxborough (Boxboro), MA Regency Hotel & Conference Center. This location is well known for its hospitality and learning environment. It offers a quiet, uninterrupted space for maximum focus and learning. Registration will be held from 7AM to 8AM on Wednesday, October 12th. Training will commence immediately and continue through the day on Friday, October 14th, until approximately 3PM. The FDI will conclude with a presentation of *Certificates of Completion*.

Candidates must be willing to commit to all days of the FDI. The maximum number of participants in the FDI is twenty (20). Each of the thirteen (13) New England Districts will initially be allotted one spot and a waiting list will ensue. Preference will be given to additional applicants from our New England Districts up until shortly before the FDI. At that (TBD) juncture we'll likely give consideration to having more from inside and outside of the region.

The cost per participant will be \$375.00, which includes lunches, dinners, breakout spaces, personal training binder and classroom materials. Overnight accommodations for two nights is required of each participant. Breakfast is not included. Both (accommodations & breakfast) are the responsibility of each participant. NELC recommends that the sponsoring district and/or club consider paying all or a portion of the cost, as an investment in your future.

The FDI will have an experienced faculty of Lions Certified Instructors (LCIP) from New England. All training materials have been developed by the Leadership/Seminars Division of Lions International. The materials have proven time after time to be exceptionally well-written for Lions faculty members and symbolize an important stepping stone to possibly becoming a Certified Instructor (LCIP).



A concession stand will be on site as well as a 50/50 raffle.




