



Vision Screening Report

June 2023

It's with great pride and gratitude that I report that this year, District 45 screened 16340 students. With 1806 referrals, the Lions were able to screen in 15 schools as well as libraries and various Lion events throughout Vermont. Even though this isn't up to the pre-covid numbers, they ARE growing, and I am sure that the next Lion year will see more growth and exposure.

This past year we also seen more school nurses contacting US asking for screenings for their students. This is proof that what we do is being noticed and appreciated. Nurses know that when Lions come into their schools, their children are getting quality care with efficient, effective methods.

With the ingenuity of Lions, we have also been able to screen students we would never have been able to reach, such as home-schooled students. More libraries are opening their doors to Lions as a location to reach children we've never had access to before. How wonder it that? I am convinced this is just the beginning of another alternative to locations we will be able to utilize in the future.

One side note here. I have recently been hired at the Springfield Area Parent/Child Center. During my introduction at a recent staff meeting, I mentioned my vision screening connection for the district since I know the Springfield Club screens the agencies' daycare center in our building. I was surprised to have someone who works as an outreach specialist speak up, quite excitedly mind you, to say they had written a grant and purchased their own camera! At first, I wasn't sure what to think until it was explained that these staff people have access to and go into private homes on a daily basis. Because of the great things these cameras can do and they have access to children we may never see until they are in school, the staff can screen individuals at home visits and rule out sight as a possible behavioral contributor for these little ones. We would never have the opportunity these developmental professionals have, so the children can now get early-on preventable care if need be. The effects of what we do is reaching out far beyond what we can even imagine and in ways we could only hope for. In doing what we do, we affect lives in marvelous ways, and it will only get better. Thank you all for your commitment to our vision screening program. You are all heroes to the children we serve.


The pool is over 70 years old and was in need of renovations. The club held a capital campaign and with the help of Vermont Lions Charity they were able to meet their capital goal.

Norwich Lions Club awards Melvin Jones Fellowship



Norwich, June 3, 2023. As part of the Norwich Women's Club recognition of Bonnie Munday, retired Norwich Town Clerk, as citizen of the year, the Norwich Lions Club awarded her membership in the Melvin Jones Fellowship (MJF) for her year-to-year work in promoting the Lions Club Memory Tree, a December fundraising campaign to benefit the Upper Valley Haven—a non-profit, private organization that

serves people struggling with poverty by providing food, shelter, education, service coordination, and other support.

The MJF is the backbone of the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) and is awarded in recognition of major donations to the foundation or to people who have recently made a notable contribution to the club's activities. It's a tremendous contribution to humanity and to the legacy of our founder, Melvin Jones.

Norwich Lions Club Meadow Muffins Contest

The Norwich Lions Club Meadow Muffins contest is a popular annual tradition, whereby participants "buy" one or more numbered plots of land in a fenced-in area for \$20 each, for which an assigned, randomized number matching a corresponding "deed" has been assigned to each plot.

On August 13, some heifers will be brought into an enclosure with the plots laid out in a grid to determine the winner and runner-up by depositing a "meadow muffin" on the squares of two lucky prize recipients!

First Prize: Up to \$1000 (10% of gross receipts) -- 1 in 500 (or better) chance of winning.

Second Prize: Up to \$500 (5% of gross receipts) -- 1 in 499 (or better) chance of winning

Third Prize: The satisfaction that you contributed to a good cause! (up to 498 in 500 chances)

If you are a winner, you will be notified by email or phone. The order of your purchase, as invoiced by 32 Auctions, determines which deed you have purchased.

Three impartial judges will be appointed to oversee the contest. In case circumstances prevent a meadow muffin deposit from determining the winners on the appointed date, the judges will draw the winning numbers from among the tickets sold. In case of errors in the sale of the Meadow Muffins, the judges will determine a fair outcome.

As I sit here writing this, there are 33 days left to our service as an International Director team from Maine and New England. On the last day of LCICON 2023 Boston a trap door will open and 17 directors and their spouses will slide out of the way for the newly-elected directors. Unless we have a pandemic, Lions International does have term limits of one two year term! It has been a blast along with hard work and many hours of travel. But it has been what we expected when I stood for election.

I want to thank all of you who had the faith in Karol and I to represent all Lions throughout the world. We also believe that we were successful in carrying New England's hospitality throughout North America, and even to Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland. And we carried much Maine Gold, aka Skowhegan maple syrup in a Lions flask, to promote our local economy while providing a gesture of friendship from us to our hosts. But our gift paled in comparison to the generosity of all the Lions who hosted us in districts and multiple districts these last two years.

We had our last official convention visitation in Metropolitan District of Halifax - MD N in the Lions world. 
